Energy States Coalition goals

- Have the states to develop work groups with utilities within their respective states
- Have the attorneys general and/or the PSC/PUC commissioners involved
- Include discussion with the RTOs from the state agency standpoint
- Potential for legal action. The state agencies need to keep that in mind when they consider various approaches under 111(d) should litigation be necessary
- What strategy would they take as a group of states with respect to litigation
- State appropriation of funding for potential litigation
- Formulate an official document from the group and conveying that to congressional delegations.
- Individual states may come out with their own plans, and it will be key to see who might join them.
- Are we capable of shaping what might come out from EPA in June?
- Multi-state utilities need a sense of what SIP-like plans may be considered by the environmental agencies, and seek out industry feedback on those concepts.

Utility/Industry goals

- We should support the environmental commissioners from state agencies and collaborate with them to utilize our strengths together.
- States may have questions or engage back with industry to help guide them in developing the bigger picture
- Develop some type of organization of industry representatives that could engage in continuing dialogue with the state environmental agencies.
- Fact based approach. Identify your emissions on a unit, state, and utility basis. Consider the age of the facilities. All of these vary by state and utility.
- There will be challenges depending on different regulatory priorities within individual states.
